## Substantiation Statement for Vermont Diesel Emissions Reduction Financial Assistance Program

The Vermont Diesel Emissions Reduction Financial Assistance Program provides funding and technical assistance for eligible diesel emission reduction projects for locomotives, marine vessels, and stationary engines. Our financial assistance program may provide funding for idle reduction technology, engine upgrades, engine repowers, and/or replacement for eligible locomotives, marine vessels, and stationary engines. The funding comes from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) under the federal Diesel Emission Reduction Act (DERA), which has certain requirements regarding eligible projects and cost share. For example, funding may be available for up to 40% of the cost (equipment and labor) of idle reduction technology, engine upgrades, and/or engine repowers for locomotives, marine vessels, and stationary engines; and up to 25% of the cost of a new replacement stationary or auxiliary diesel powered electric generator (genset).

Specifically, projects involving locomotives and marine engines are not eligible for funding if the emission reductions are required by EPA's locomotive and marine rule, "Control of Emissions of Air Pollution from Locomotives and Marine Compression-Ignition Engines Less than 30 liters per Cylinder." Also, projects involving stationary engines will not be considered for funding if the emission reductions proposed for funding are required by EPA's RICE rule, "National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for Stationary Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engines (40 CFR Part 63 Subpart ZZZZ)". Projects which include locomotives and/or marine engines and/or stationary engines must provide a clear and concise justification for why/how the proposed emission reductions are not subject to the Restriction for Mandated Measures. The justification must clearly demonstrate that:

- the target engines are exempt from any federal requirements; or
- emission reductions funded under the Program will be implemented prior to the effective date of any applicable federal requirements; and/or
- emission reductions funded under the Program will not be used to satisfy any applicable federal requirements, but instead are in excess of (above and beyond) those required by the applicable mandate.
